




What We Do:

Invest From the Ground Up Campaign

Education and Outreach Program

Invest From the Ground Up Campaign Education and Outreach Program

Launched in late 2012, the campaign has already made in-roads with professionals, municipalities and community organizations throughout the state. The campaign hosts a statewide presence through a website with bi-weekly informative blogs and active social media presence. By the end of 2013, the website had over 7K visitors and 500 Facebook Likes.

In addition, in 2013, the Invest From the Ground Up Education and Outreach campaign made tree-mendous in-roads in local communities throughout the state:

In East Hollywood, there was a growing understanding (25%) that caring for trees increases business.

In Bakersfield, there was a 180° change in attitude toward tree planting programs by the City of Bakersfield as seen by collaborative grantwriting and planting and caring for trees.

In Santee, 80% (24 of 30) people said they would be willing to provide basic care to their trees such as water.

In Albany, there were more than 300 new requests by homeowners and business owners for street trees!











Invest From the Ground Up Campaign Tree Planting Program

The Invest From the Ground Up Tree Planting Program is an outgrowth of our former United Voices program and is a large-scale, regional tree planting program.

On February 15, 2014, the program will plant approximately 1,500 trees in multiple communities across the Bay Area and South San Joaquin Valley with the help of 1,000s of volunteers!

It's estimated that these trees will remove over 2,000 metric tons of Carbon Dioxide annually – the equivalent of taking almost 500 cars of the road. Over 3,000 metric tons of air pollutants will also be removed - helping Californians breathe easier.



















Investing From the Ground Up: Community Tree Success Video

To expand the reach of the Invest From the Ground Up program's message to Californians of the value of caring for their trees, we produced a short video featuring three inspiring real-life stories that demonstrate the benefits of trees.

The video includes a business owner in Bishop, a resident in Hunting Beach and homeowners in Albany sharing in the own words how trees have transformed their lives.

This powerful video was shared through CaUFC's network and those of our partners. The video achieved over 2.000 views on YouTube in two months and continues to reach more Californian's daily.


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



Fiscal Year 2013 Financial Summary

Total revenues for the year reached \$611,890.00. Operating expenses were \$66,153.00.


As always, we owe a debt of gratitude to our volunteers. Their contributions to our board, regional councils, and events is not accounted for in our financial statements.

It is notable that in-kind donations for the Invest From the Ground Up program alone exceeded \$280,185.68 in 2013!










The Impacts of Urban Forestry for Californians

Together, we can strongly influence the longterm impacts on communities in a variety of ways, including attention toward legislation, addressing greenhouse gas reduction and sustainable strategies creating integrated land-use and transportation planning.

Smart green infrastructure policies assist in meeting carbon goals, while simultaneously addressing watershed, air quality, energy and clean and adequate water supplies. Certainly the economic impacts, from dollars spent annually in urban forestry related industries to job creation, are not to be overlooked – contributing over 62,000 jobs and \$3.9 billion to the State's economy in 2009, a 24% increase from the early 1990's. With an emphasis on green jobs, these numbers are only expected to grow in the future.
