About the Urban and Community Forestry (UCF) Program


The USDA Forest Service Urban and Community Forestry (UCF) Program is the only dedicated urban forest program in the federal government.

The UCF Program assists State Forestry agencies and partner organizations in addressing and applying nature-based solutions to chronic and emergent economic, social, and environmental challenges in communities across the United States.

The Urban Community Forestry Program and Justice 40

- The UCF Program is a covered program under USDA's Justice40 Initiative established through Executive Order 13985.
- A minimum of 40% of UCF Program investments will directly benefit disadvantaged communities through:
 - Increased access to nature and associated public health benefits
 - Newly planted trees that provide shade and reduce extreme heat conditions at the neighborhood level

IRA allows:

\$1.5 billion to the UCF Program to remain available until September 30, 2031

NOFO by the Numbers

The funding opportunity is open to proposals spanning a broad range of costs from eligible entities working at a community, regional, and national scale.

Who is eligible to apply for funding?

- State government entity
- Local government entity
- Agency or governmental entity of the District of Columbia
- Agency or governmental entity of an insular area
 - Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, Northern Mariana Islands, Federal States of Micronesia,
 Marshall Islands, Palau, Virgin Islands
- Federally Recognized Tribes, Alaska Native Corporations/villages, and Tribal organizations
- Nonprofit organizations
- Public and State-controlled institutions of higher education
- Community-based organizations



What type of activities are eligible for funding?

A few examples:

- Fostering community engagement in urban forest planning, planting, and management
- Protecting, enhancing, and expanding equitable urban tree canopy cover
- Encouraging systematic maintenance and monitoring of urban trees and forest



What type of activities are eligible for funding? (cont.)

A few examples:

- Improving climate resilience (e.g. storm preparedness)
- Providing paid training experiences for urban forestry crews
- Developing paid on-the-job opportunities to expand green workforce development
- Addressing the impact of exotic invasive pests in urban forests



What type of activities are NOT eligible for funding?

- Basic research
 - (Note: technical transfer, education, and outreach activities associated with applying research can be included in the application)
- Land acquisition
- Small business start-up funding
- Equipment purchases
 - (Note: equipment rental should be considered as an alternative)
- Construction and infrastructure improvements

Private Lands

Funds are encouraged for projects on publicly accessible lands

If you want to work on **private lands** you will need to come up with mechanisms to ensure these projects last:

- MOUs with landowners
- Easements
- Agreements/pledges by the resident
- Education workshops
- Partner-provided maintenance, monitoring schemes/schedules



Reporting Requirements

- Semi Annual Reporting is required (June/Dec)
- These reports are going to be reviewed both at a regional and national level and will need have a written and budget component.

Subgrant Opportunities

For applicants that plan to subgrant, a minimum of 80% of federal funding awarded must be competitively sub-awarded to deliver urban and community forestry program benefits at the community level.



Match and Match-waivers

All federal grant funds are to be **matched at least equally** (dollar for dollar) with non-federal match.

Match-waivers are available for proposals that deliver 100% of the funding/program benefits to disadvantaged communities

- What is considered a "disadvantaged community"?
 - Use online **vulnerability and environmental justice equity data tools** to support a disadvantaged community designation or other **government sponsored** vulnerability tools which inform metrics applicable to the scope of work.
 - Can use multiple tools for justification

How will project proposals be evaluated?

Proposal Selection Criteria (100 Points TOTAL):

- (0-30 Points) **Alignment** with <u>Justice 40</u>, <u>State Forest Action Plan</u>, and <u>Ten-Year National Urban and Community Forestry Plan priorities CA State Forest Action Plan</u>
- (0-20 Points) Technical merit
- (0-20 Points) Capability and capacity to carry out the proposed work within the grant period
- (0-20 Points) **Measurable** results or outcomes
- (0-10 Points) **Budget and cost-effectiveness**


